To be eligible for graduation with the Associate in Arts Degree, you must satisfy the following requirements:

- ⇒ Complete at least 20 credits from Rainy River Community College in courses numbered 1000 or above. No courses numbered below 1000 may be used to complete the degree.
- ⇒ Only 6 credits taken pass/fail may be applied to the AA.
- ⇒ Complete all 40 credits of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) with a minimum GPA of 2.0.
- ⇒ Complete all additional Associate in Arts (AA) requirements to equal 60 credits, with a minimum GPA of 2.0.

- * denotes a course with a prerequisite.
- The information in this graduation worksheet is for use as an academic planning tool and is subject to change.
- A course can be used in up to two goal areas (cross-listed) of the MnTC; however, the credits for any course can count only once toward the total degree credits. The second goal area is indicated with /#/ after the course name.

- For students matriculating during the 2011-2012 academic year, this degree plan is applicable through Summer Session 2016.
